Launch of the "Improving Quality Standards of Agro-Processors Through Training" Project



The GCCI and the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) hosted a press conference to launch the "Improving Quality Standards of Agro-Processors Through Training" Project on October 17th. 2019. The Executive Director, the CTCS Liaison Officer and representatives of the CDB also met with the GTA, The Tourism Hospitality Association of Guyana (THAG) and the Guyana Office for Investment (GOInvest). The project will build capacity, increase standards and certification, improve labelling and packaging and provide technical support to at least 20 firms in the agro-processing sector.
